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RESEARCHERS FROM NON-EU COUNTRIES

How to enroll in the National Health Service

Dear researcher,

if the non-EU country you come from has not entered into agreements with Italy for health care, you can resort to private insurance or voluntarily register with the National Health Service.

Voluntary registration with the National Health Service entitles you to healthcare assistance in Italy, it's valid for the calendar year (from January 1st to December 31st) and cannot be divided.

Registration involves the payment of an annual lump sum contribution. If you have dependent family members, the contribution is calculated on the basis of income.

If you intend to enroll in the National Health Service, you must deliver the following documents to the health registry office at Palazzo Bo':

1. Original residency permit or receipt of the postal kit with entry visa in the passport
2. Passport Copy
3. Research Fellow Certificate
4. Certification relating to a possible award of a scholarship
5. RESIDENT RESEARCHERS: certification of residence or self-certification of residence
6. NON-RESIDENT RESEARCHERS: copy of the rental or residence contract in student residences or declaration of hospitality
7. RESEARCHERS WITHOUT DEPENDENT FAMILY MEMBERS: Copy of form F24, with tax code 8846, Regional code 21, reference year - year of registration with the NHS. The F24 form with the relevant instructions can be downloaded [from the Revenue Agency website](#)
8. RESEARCHERS WITH DEPENDENT FAMILY MEMBERS: In this case the contribution will be calculated as a percentage of income according to the provisions of the Ministerial Decree 8 October 1986 (contact the health registry office to find out the exact percentage or write an email to uniulss@aulss6.veneto.it). The contribution allows the dependent family member to have health care.
